

Day 15 Sunday 30 June

Stone Town Zanzibar

Take a guided walking tour of this most historic town taking in the narrow streets and striking architecture. Visit the old Sultan's Palace known as the House of Wonders, the Palace Museum, Dr Livingstone's house, the old Arab fort and Zanzibar's exotic spice markets. Meander down shaded alleyways admiring Arabic architecture, ornately carved studded doorways and balconies, cathedrals and mosques.

Day 2 Monday 17 June

Doha to Tanzania
After a good connection in Doha you fly to Kilimanjaro airport in Tanzania arriving mid-afternoon. Here you are met and taken to your comfortable hotel in Arusha. Before dinner you have an informal meet and greet with your local hosts. Arusha is a vibrant, multicultural city, international diplomatic hub and gateway to the fabulous Serengeti, Ngorongoro and Africa’s highest peak Mount Kilimanjaro.

Day 3 Tuesday 18 June

Arusha
Tour Arusha after a relaxed breakfast today with your local expert guide. Begin with a walking tour of the centre then visit the colourful central market and the Maasai art and craft market. You also have a guided tour of the

Tanzanite Museum. Lunch is taken in a local restaurant where you experience real Tanzanian cooking. A welcome dinner is arranged at your hotel tonight.

Day 4 Wednesday 19 June

Arusha
Today you visit the Umoja Centre where young Tanzanians have the opportunity to access education, empowerment and freedom from poverty and exploitation. You also visit the Shanga bead project, a fascinating recycling project which supports people with disabilities and the Cultural Heritage gallery of African art. Lunch is taken in the leafy gardens of the Arusha Coffee Lodge estate.

Day 5 Thursday 20 June

Arusha to Ngorongoro
Travel to the world renowned Ngorongoro Conservation Park stopping at a Maasai tribal village on the way. Visit homes, enjoy traditional dancing and learn about the iconic Maasai lifestyle. Check in to your lodge on the UNESCO World Heritage listed crater’s rim then set out into the unique, otherworldly landscape; an African highlight. Descending into the crater itself you have a picnic lunch overlooking the hippo pool. Ngorongoro is Maasai for ‘Gift of Life’ and life is teeming here with elephant, lion, buffalo and zebra.

Day 6 Friday 21 June

Ngorongoro to Lake Victoria via Serengeti
After breakfast you travel through World Heritage listed Serengeti National Park, truly one of the greatest national parks in the world. Serengeti is Maasai for ‘endless plains’. As well as the Big Five; rhinoceros, elephant, leopard, buffalo and lion the plains host immense populations of giraffe, baboon, colobus monkey, antelope, crocodile, hippo and ostriche. There are opportunities for game viewing along the way and a picnic lunch before arriving at Lake Victoria, the largest lake in Africa with shores in Tanzania, Uganda and Kenya.

Day 7 Saturday 22 June

Lake Victoria
Spend a day on this great lake today. Enjoy a canoe boat ride where you see hippo, monitor lizards, kingfishers and more then lunch in a local restaurant. You also visit a traditional fishing village and a primary school.

Day 8 Sunday 23 June

Lake Victoria to Serengeti National Park
Head into the Serengeti after breakfast today to spend the next two nights. There are an estimated three million large game animals in this phenomenal park. There are opportunities for game viewing and a picnic lunch along the way. Your accommodation is in a comfortable tented camp overlooking the beautiful Seronera Valley and situated strategically on a main zebra and wildebeest migration corridor. It is a perfect setting to enjoy magical African sunsets and star filled skies.

Day 9 Monday 24 June

Serengeti National Park
Take an early sunrise game drive as the Serengeti slowly awakes in a golden light. Return to camp for a hearty breakfast and rest before setting out into the vast Serengeti savannah for a picnic lunch and to take in the beauty and magnitude of this awe inspiring park. Return to camp in the early evening.

Day 10 Tuesday 25 June

Serengeti to Lake Eyasi
After breakfast you travel to uniquely beautiful Lake Eyasi game viewing and admiring the changing landscapes along the way. Off the beaten path, Eyasi is a shallow salt lake on the floor of the Great Rift Valley.

Day 11 Wednesday 26 June

Lake Eyasi
Experience the culture of the Hadzabe today, a reclusive indigenous ethnic group of bushpeople who largely live as their ancestors did many years before. They are among the last group of hunter gatherers in Africa. Your visit is in the early morning for a bushwalk when the Hadzabe are most active hunting and collecting food for the day. You also visit the equally fascinating Datoga people after breakfast at your lodge. The Datoga are pastoralists and skilled craftsmen who make arrowheads which are used by the Hadzabe. After lunch at the lodge you visit Lake Eyasi, a seasonal resting place for migrating flamingos.

Day 12 Thursday 27 June

Lake Eyasi to Marangu Mountains
Today you head to the cool, lush slopes of Kilimanjaro via Karatu where the Iraqw people grow beans, maize, sunflowers and millet. You visit craft centres and an art gallery along the way and have a relaxed lunch near the leafy banks of the Usa River where beautiful birds and monkeys can be seen. Continue on to Marangu with its delightful highland atmosphere.

Day 13 Friday 28 June

Marangu
Tour this lovely foothills region today including the market town of Marangu which is surrounded by banana and coffee plantations. You spend time with the Chagga people of Marangu and visit the blacksmiths, local brewery, museum and plantations then visit the Marangu gate of the Mt Kilimanjaro National Park.

Day 14 Saturday 29 June

Marangu to Zanzibar
Today you are transferred to Kilimanjaro airport and fly to Stone Town the capital of Unguja Island, otherwise known as Zanzibar. This picturesque archipelago in the Indian Ocean has a rich history from the ancient Persians to the Sultans of Oman and Muscat and the cultural influences are distinct and diverse. Check in to your hotel in historic Stone Town this afternoon.
