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

Day 4 Tuesday 09 September

Athens to Nafplion

Visit the Athens Archaeological Museum considered one of the world's greatest museums, to see some of its breathtaking treasures such as the golden Mask of Agamemnon, then depart for Corinth. Ancient Corinth flourished as a major Greek city from the 8th century BC until its destruction by the Romans in 146 BC. A canal through the Isthmus of Corinth to connect the Ionian and Aegean Seas was begun under Emperor Nero in 67 AD but never completed leaving ships to be dragged on rollers across the isthmus. A canal was completed in 1893. See the Temple of Apollo and the Peirene Fountain then UNESCO World Heritage Tiryns. A hill





fort with occupation dating back to the beginning of the Bronze Age, the walls of Tiryns seem to have been built by giants. See the birthplace of Heracles and the ancient fort with a guide then continue to lovely Nafplion to check in and enjoy dinner arranged at your hotel.

Day 5 Wednesday 10 September

Nafplion & Epidaurus

Nafplion was the first capital of Greece and is one of its prettiest towns, crowned by two medieval fortresses and the small island fortress of Bourtzi. Today you have a tour of Nafplion with its marble pavements and elegant buildings of remarkably homogenous architectural style as well as Bourtzi. Tour Epidaurus this afternoon, reputed to be the birthplace of Apollo's son Asklepios who's sanctuary the Asclepieion was the most celebrated healing centre of the Classical world. See the theatre of Epidaurus amongst other treasures and delight in an evening at leisure to enjoy the Mediterranean atmosphere, cafes and restaurants of Nafplion.

Mycenae & Nemea

The Bronze Age city of Mycenae was once thought to exist only in Greek legend and the poetry of Homer. It wasn't until 1870 that archaeologist Heinrich Schliemann discovered the fabled city using landmarks from the text of the Iliad. Here he discovered many precious objects including the golden Mask of Agamemnon. UNESCO World Heritage listed you enter via the Lion Gate with your local guide and visit the place where Agamemnon was slaughtered by his wife and some incredible domed tombs. Continue to ancient Nemea famous in Greek mythology as the home of the Nemean Lion which was killed by Heracles. Nemea nestles in a picturesque wine region and has a small museum and remarkably well preserved stadium complete with an athlete's tunnel. Lunch is included today in a local village with a Greek feast to share.

Day 7 Friday 12 September

Argos & Olympia

Drive to Olympia today stopping in Argos, a powerful rival of Sparta and one of the oldest continually inhabited cities in the world, to see its ancient theatre. In Olympia you have a guided tour of the excellent Archaeological Museum one of the richest in Greece. Continue to the original Olympic Games site which includes the ancient stadium, the Palaestra where wrestling was performed and the Leonidaion athletes lodging. You also see the significant Bouleuterion Council and Senate House where public affairs were discussed, the Temple of Hera and the remains of the 5th century Doric Temple of Zeus.

Day 8 Saturday 13 September

Olympia to Delphi

After breakfast you depart Olympia and cross the magnificent Rio Antirio Bridge over the Bay of Corinth. Stop for free time in charming mediaeval Nafpaktos on the waterfront of the Gulf of Corinth before continuing to breathtaking Delphi the so called navel of the earth. Arriving at this mystical site you tour the evocative ruins of the Temple of Apollo, the Temple of Hera and the theatre and you might contemplate where the Oracle sat on her tripod over the cleft in the rock to utter her ambiguous prophesies. Visit the Delphi Museum if time permits before dinner.

Delphi to Crete

Depart Delphi for Eleftherios Venizelos airport for your short flight to Crete. Theseus the Hero slayed the Minotaur after finding his way in to the maze with the aid of Ariadne and her ball of string. On arrival you check to your well located hotel for dinner.

Knosso

Today you have a guided tour of the incredible palace of Knossos the ancient capital of the Minoan Kingdom. This civilization was one of the greatest ever and the centre of power in Crete. In the late afternoon you arrive in Rethymno a traditional Cretean seaside town perfect for the next two nights stay.
